Boost for community safety!

Witzenberg Municipality recently handed over much-needed safety equipment to the Prince Alfred Hamlet Community Policing Forum (CPF) and related Neighbourhood Watches (NHWs) in PA Hamlet and Op die Berg in order to equip those on the ground who are assisting us to keep our communities safe and to promote community safety in the greater municipal area. This initiative by the newly established Witzenberg Community Safety Forum was funded by the Cape Winelands District Municipality for local safety projects to assist in the fight against crime. The equipment that was handed over include: flashlights and batteries, as well as safety boots.

ELECTRICITY TARIFFS

Following a study regarding the cost of electricity supply that was undertaken by the municipality, the tariffs will be phased in from 1 July 2025 until the 2027/28 financial year.

The purpose of the study, as required by NERSA, was to determine the actual cost for the provision of electricity to various consumers. Certain costs are regarded as fixed costs, i.e. costs that are not affected by the actual consumption of electricity. These costs must be financed by the fixed charges such as basic fees and capacity charges.

Electricity tariffs for household consumers with credit meters have been adjusted as follows:

It is estimated that the electricity cost of a residential consumer with a credit meter, 60-amp connection and an electricity consumption of 800 kWh per month will increase by 11.3%.

Consumers have the choice to reduce the connection size (amp), but this may necessitate improved planning of electricity usage, and they may not be able to use all equipment at the same time.

Fortunately, NERSA approved the pre-paid electricity tariffs for 2025/26 without any fixed costs. Consumers therefore have a further option to change to a pre-paid electricity meter.





Collaborative Effort Delivers New Burn Unit to Ceres Hospital

The new Burn Unit at Ceres Hospital officially opened today, bringing specialised care closer to rural communities. This milestone was made possible through a partnership between the Western Cape Department of Health and Wellness and the Children's Hospital Trust, with clinical support from Red Cross War Memorial Children's Hospital.

The opening was supported by **Executive Mayor Clir Trevor Abrahams**, who welcomed the facility as a vital investment in local healthcare. The unit aims to reduce the need for long distance referrals and improve outcomes through early intervention. It marks a major step forward in delivering equitable, **quality healthcare** for the Witzenberg region.

JUNIOR TOWN COUNCIL COMMUNITY PROGRAMME

A Junior Town Council (JTC) community programme, a community initiative to educate learners and the broader community about the operations and role of the Municipality (Local Government), was recently launched in the Witzenberg.

The very first JTC members were inducted during a special inauguration ceremony held in the Ceres Town Hall on 17 September 2025. The current JTC consists of 12 learners from four different school: Bella Vista High School, Charlie Hofmeyr High School, De Eike Primary School and Ingcingazethu High School. The theme: "Where Young Ideas Shape a Better Town".

However, it is important to note that this is NOT a municipal structure nor a formal programme of the municipality. The Municipality only provides logistical support where needed and possible.

The JTC is an initiative that was started by a group of former educators who are connected to various schools in our municipal area. They have communicated recently that they invited all local schools in the Witzenberg area to participate in the programme, but only four schools opted to participate this year.

The programme aims to inform learners about the daily operations of the Municipality, the various municipal services offered, the Municipal systems and structures, and what is expected from the Town Council. Its aim is to educate and empower youth in understanding local governance and basic service delivery.

The JTC members will also assist with community-based programmes related to uplifting the youth, sport, social issues, skill development and more. The group of facilitating teachers hope that more schools will participate in future.

Free Workshop held for Spaza Shop Owners in Witzenberg

Witzenberg Municipality in collaboration with the Municipal Health Services Section of the Cape Winelands District Municipality recently presented a free workshop in Ceres for spaza shop owners from across the Witzenberg municipal area. The objective was to teach the spaza shop owners specifically how to ensure the health and safety of their shops and customers, thus community food safety. They could lean more about: food handling and hygiene standards; municipal requirements; certification and inspections; safe storage and temperature control; and labelling of prepacked food and snacks. The programme also included information sessions on: town planning and land use applications for spaza shops; Business licensing and spaza shop financial assistance; Vending and prepaid electricity; Law Enforcement; Municipal Health Services and Certification of Acceptability; and the Purpose and Objectives of the National Empowerment Fund for spaza shops.
